

**Walk and Group Visit to Barnards Farm Gardens

"The gardens and grounds at Barnards Farm are magnificent," National Garden Scheme, 2009.

Prior to our afternoon visit to the Farm I will be leading a morning walk (5 miles approx.) around Ingrave. Following this we will head South on the A128 to the farm gardens, about 10 minutes away by car.

Barnards Farm is a 17 hectare garden, where we can enjoy woodlands, ponds and a dramatic sculpture park. The latter has works by Lavarenne, Anthony Gormley and Elizabeth Frink. There are also panoramic views from a belvedere and a Japanese garden, etc. The farm grounds are owned by Mr and Mrs Holmes and the Christabela Charitable Trust and is part of the National Garden Scheme, which supports a number of charities. The admission donation is £6 p.p. with tea and cakes available at extra cost. Experience it all by contacting me for a place before 11th April. Only 35 places are possible, so early booking is advisable. Please car share if you can. I will try and link people up if needed.
